

PRESS-VARIANTS AND EMENDATIONS IN *MONSIEUR D'OLIVE* (1606)

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My article on "Bibliographical Studies of George Chapman's *Monsieur D'Olive* (1606) Printed by Thomas Creede" appeared some months ago in *Studies in English Literature* (English Number 1963). And now with a view to supplementing it, the present paper has been prepared.

The general intent of this paper, therefore, is to list all the press-variants found in the quarto of 1606, my emendations of accidentals which, in most cases, concern the matter of punctuation, and some substantive basic emendations which an editor of the play will probably transfer to footnotes on his text.

A Short-title Catalogue of Books, 1475-1640, compiled by A. W. Pollard and G. R. Redgrave (reprinted in 1956), *A Checklist of American Copies of "Short-title Catalogue" Books*, compiled by W. W. Bishop (second edition in 1950), and *A Finding-List of English Books to 1640 in Libraries in the British Isles*, compiled by David Ramage (published by the University of Durham in 1958) record the present whereabouts of the extant copies of *Monsieur D'Olive*. I have collated them all. They are as follows:

The copy belonging to the Elizabethan Club, Yale University Library (CtY) is not only entirely free from any physical defects, but the readings in all its sheets except sheet H stand in the corrected state. And it has been chosen as the copy-text.

The treatment of it, however, cannot help being an exceptional one. As the list of press-variants shows, the uncorrected state of sheet B bears more authority than the corrected. The sole reason for the correction of the sheet was its wrong imposition in the W. A. Clark Memorial Library copy (CLUC). The copy alone provides us with the readings coming direct from the printer's copy while the readings in other copies are merely those derived from CLUC. Needless to say, therefore, the CLUC uncorrected readings ought to be, with good discretion, incorporated in the copy-text. The incorporation will effect the spelling changes of almost every word on some pages of the sheet in the copy-text, and the changes will be found in my list of press-variants in Section I. Also the incorporation may entail some number of substantive, in the true sense of the word, alterations in the copy-text readings, which I think it justifiable to list independent of my emendations of accidentals.

My emendations of the accidentals of the copy-text have been confined to the minimum. Those who are accustomed to the late Elizabethan and Jacobean practice of punctuation marks will find no difficulties in distinguishing the queries in the copy-text for the exclamatory sentences. So all of these queries have been retained. The alterations in the punctuation of the copy-text have been introduced only where, in my opinion, modern students of normal standard of the Elizabethan and Jacobean dramatic printed books would be seriously misled, and where I

thought the individual punctuation mark in the copy-text is obviously wrong (particularly in sheets C and D). The accidentals of the speech-prefixes as a rule have been neglected, and those unnecessarily italicized initial capitals ignored which appear mostly in sheets A and B. Likewise the unnecessary italicization of punctuation marks has not come under my consideration.

The shorthand symbols advocated by Mckerrow⁽²⁾ and adopted by Bowers⁽³⁾ are employed in the list of my emendations.

Between the quarto of 1606 (STC 4983) and its another issue (STC 4984), there is practically no difference; it is only the title-page that differs. Therefore, the reading following the square bracket is always that of the quarto, unless otherwise stated.

Some of the emendations by the past editors have been adopted with due credit ascribed to them.

The following is the abbreviations used in Sections II and III:

The play was included in *The Comedies and Tragedies of George Chapman*, which was published by Pearson in 1873. This is a reprint of Chapman's old quartos, but introduces numerous errors of its own, and can hardly deserve consultation.
